As the pandemic seems to be on the wane, and the local and CDC guidelines change, we at the GROS will once again be meeting in person - please note the current JCC health rules with which we all must comply. Please check the GROS website for a list of the current JCC guidelines.

We are going to try something different for the March meeting - a Vandaceous Workshop presented by our members themselves! A Vandaceous plant is anything related to the genus *Vanda*, including *Ascocenda*, *Neofinetia falcata* (recently moved into the genus *Vanda*, *Aerides*, *Rhynchostylis* and many more, including intergeneric hybrids. *Phalaenopsis* is also included in the Vandaceae, but we will not be discussing *Phalaenopsis* on Monday.

This program is not only for the members - but also presented by our members. Please bring your Vandaceous plants (excluding *Phalaenopsis*.) The plants do not need to be in bloom. The discussion will be primarily about growing plants, not flowers: flowers are the reward for successful growing! We will all discuss how to grow these plants, learn from different methods of growing, and will learn from both successes and failures.

If plans work out, we will also have Vandaceous seedlings available at a low cost for members who wish to try some of these plants for themselves.

We will also discuss our upcoming Spring orchid show, set for April 1-3, 2022. We will have numerous sign-up sheets - think what you might like to help with. We will also have Member Sales Table stickers and paperwork available for all members who want to sell plants at the Show. See the details inside this newsletter. All of the relevant paper forms may be downloaded from our website's Orchid Show page.

The Show Table will be back - live and in person! - so don't forget to bring your flowering orchids - even if they're not Vandas. We'll see you there!

## Meeting Minutes for Mon. Feb. 7, 2022

Jeanne opened the meeting with our speaker Francisco Miranda who spoke on Brazilian Orchids. His talk was followed by our Business Meeting. 18 members were present on Zoom.

Fran made a motion to accept last months minutes. Sue Ackerman 2nd the motion. No one was opposed, the motion passed.

### *Treasurers Report:*

We have about \$14,000.00 We have 2 new/renewing memberships: Marium Heidt and Dwaine Levy.

Expenses this month were for the show post-cards/posters, postage. JCC rental for March & May, and tonight's speaker.

Noel Krzesinski has been in contact with the George Eastman House. Plant drop off is this Wed. & Thurs. The show is Feb. 11- March 6. The plants don't have to stay the whole time.

### *Show Details:*

- Austin Miller is in charge of the GROS show table set up. Plants need to be Pre registered, and dropped off on Friday after 10. (The earlier the better.) He's requesting filler plants, and moss. Fran will try to get a box of moss. Claire will also help with the display. Austin is requesting floral tape and stakes for the display- we'll check into that, but usually have done minimal staking of members plants.
- Lewis Tandy and Austin and Fran will be there for set up and take down.
- Phil Matt will be in charge of the members table. Members who sell also have to do a 3 hour shift at the table. GROS subtracts 15% +8% sales tax (=23%) for each plant sold by a member- your price should have that included. The 30 plant limit is no longer divided into 2 day sections. Bring all plants in on Friday, we will revisit the quantity if they all sell quickly.
- Diane will have sign up sheets for the March meeting. There are all kinds of jobs available. Everyone needs to think about what they can sign up for to help with the show.
- Jeanne is in charge of Judging and Clerking. Clerking is a great way to learn about plants. You have to be there at 7:15 on Saturday morning. (Emily may be interested in trying this)
- Jeanne is also in charge of Lectures. Dave Weiss will give a Beginner Orchids talk on both Saturday and Sunday. Natalie will give her talk on

growing orchids outside during summer on both days. Jeanne will give a talk on Sunday.

- Mary can do the repotting station 1 day from 1 until the end of that day.

Natalie Auburn made a motion to close the meeting.

Fran Murphy 2nd the meeting, and the Business section was ended.

Virtual Show table was presented, starting with a Murphy's Orchid tour, followed by other members plants.

'RHS' = Royal Horticultural Society (official hybrid registrar)</p> <p>RHS does NOT register forms, only by genus and species. Anywhere a plant is labeled 'coerulea' or 'fma coerulea' or 'alba' or 'fma alba' etc. that part of the information is omitted from the RHS registry.</p> <p>Accordingly, I have only included the form names as horticultural identifiers.</p> <p><sup>1</sup>RHS does not recognize the forma hainaense designation</p> <p><sup>2</sup>My tag says moquetteanum. Some authorities rank moquetteanum as a variety of glaucophyllum, others rank it as a separate species. RHS sticks with just glaucophyllum.</p> <p><sup>3</sup>RHS does not recognize Phrag wallisii as a valid species. Parentage per RHS.</p> <p><sup>4</sup>I believe this is Ornithocephalus inflexus based on a comparison with photos in the IOSPE, but many Ornithocephalus species in the IOSPE database are illustrated by anatomical line drawings not photos, so I cannot be certain.</p>
