After our very successful Spring Show, the GROS leaps into Spring with a visit from Art Chadwick of Chadwick & Son Orchids of Richmond, VA.

Art will present, “First Ladies and Their Cattleyas,” the subject of the soon-to-be-published book he authored with his father. Art will explore the 100+ year history of US First Ladies and the Cattleya hybrids that bear their names. The lineage of these plants provides an overview of the diverse family of Cattleya species that exist in nature as well as an inside look at the renowned growers around the world who played a role in creating these enduring legacies. Included are the fascinating stories of the actual flower presentations, many of which involved the Chadwicks.

Chadwick & Son Orchids Inc. was founded in 1989 by long time orchid hobbyist Art A. Chadwick, his wife, Anne, and their son, Arthur E. Chadwick.

The early success of the company can be traced to Art Sr., who had been growing orchids since 1945, and provided invaluable cultural and hybridizing experience. His many Cattleya hybrids adorn the pages of orchid magazines worldwide and he continues to be a regular feature writer for the American Orchid Society.

Art will bring with him orchids to sell, and his current book “The Classic Cattleyas” – 2nd Edition. He can also take preorders of his upcoming book, “First Ladies and their Cattleyas: A Century of Namesake Orchids”, due for release later this Spring. If members would like to look at Chadwick’s website and place special Cattleya orders for Art to bring with him to the meeting, please wait for your email from the GROS as to how to arrange this.

Meeting Minutes for Mon. Mar. 7, 2022

Jeanne Kaeding opened with the business meeting. There were 24 people present with no new members and 1 visitor present.

Sue Ackerman gave the Treasurers report. Current balance is about \$13,600. The only expenses this month were for the Vanda seedlings. We had 5 paid members totaling \$150.00. (Some were for multiple years.)

Natalie Auburn read a card that we received from the family of John Kellas. His family thanked GROS for the (\$100.00) donation to AOS (designated for conservation) in honor of John who recently passed away.

Diane Bernard brought in information about a free Smithsonian orchid related zoom meeting - posted through April 24. She also mentioned a free Orchid Conservation symposium on March 24, 2022.

Fran Murphy talked about a possible group order for Rexus bark. He needs commitments for 60 bags (medium size- possibly some small seedling size too) in order to place it. He has commitments for 35 so far. He will have an email sent out about it to see who is interested. (Bob Wyman said he had purchased a bag of Pine Bark from Lowes that he sifted and was happy with.)

Show news:

Set up is April 1 from 9- 8. The show is April 2 & 3. There were sign up sheets for all kinds of things. We need help with clerking and judging plants early Friday morning. We need help with both setup and tear down. We need help with hosting, food, repotting etc.. We need everyone to help and participate with as much as they are able!

Phil Matt is in charge of the member table. If you plan to sell plants at the show, you need to contact Phil. You will be given a registration "letter", as well as sheets of stickers and a sales form. Anyone who sells plants at the GROS table must be a current member. Your price needs to reflect the fact that GROS deducts 15% as well as the 8% NY state sales tax.

Austin Miller is in charge of the GROS exhibit. He requested that members stake

their plants before the show if they can. All plants must be pre registered, and dropped off as early as possible so he can get the display up. If you can't get there early, please try and contact someone else to get them there for you. Austin is also looking for filler plants.

We then had an informal workshop on growing Vandaceous orchids. About 10 members brought in different examples of plants that they are growing. (They ranged from small struggling plants to faithful bloomers.) Different members talked about different methods and environments they grow them in. Sue Ackerman had several articles from a recent AOS magazine marked for members to take a look at. Afterwards GROS had seedlings available to purchase by members. The 1st plant was \$1.00 with additional plants available for \$4.00 each.

The plant raffle was held, and then the show table was presented. The meeting was adjourned.

2022 Spring Show Wrapup

GROS hosted our annual Orchid Show and Sale this year on April 2-3 at the Rochester Museum and Science Center. Our last show was held in 2019; the public seemed to be glad the show had returned. Attendance is estimated to have been at about 840 people. Admission charged was \$10 per person. We are especially thrilled to report that 88 memberships to GROS were purchased at the admissions table during the show. This included 4 renewed, 55 new family, and 29 new individual memberships.

We were happy to have orchid societies from Niagara Falls, Syracuse, and Binghamton participate with their society displays. We also appreciated participation from Sonnenberg Gardens, Bergen Swamp Preservation Society

and Ikebana International Rochester Chapter 53. This year's vendors included Windswept in Time, J & L Orchids, Bergen Water Gardens, and Oakwood Orchids.

Our members' sale table contained plants from 9 of our members; all but a few of the plants were purchased by enthusiastic guests. A repotting service was offered again this year; over 35 plants were repotted for a nominal fee. 250 of the ever-popular orchid-gami sheets were purchased, proceeds of which will be donated to the North American Orchid Conservation Center.

Ribbon judging took place on Saturday morning and AOS judging continued through the day. Six AOS awards were given, including the AOS Show Trophy to GROS. Please see the accompanying table for ribbon and award details.

Of our 59 members (whose dues were paid prior to the show), 31 contributed to the show in some way. Many thanks go out to all who volunteered their time and expertise; putting on a show of this size and quality is definitely a group effort.

Proceeds from our annual auction and show plus membership fees fund our club for the year and make donations to orchid-related organizations possible. Speakers, programs and activities, as well as meeting space rental and Zoom fees, insurance, website and post office box fees and organizational memberships cost us about \$7500 a year. Offering an annual orchid show and sale makes quite a bit possible. Please consider participating in the annual show and sale next year; expected dates March 30-April 2, 2023.

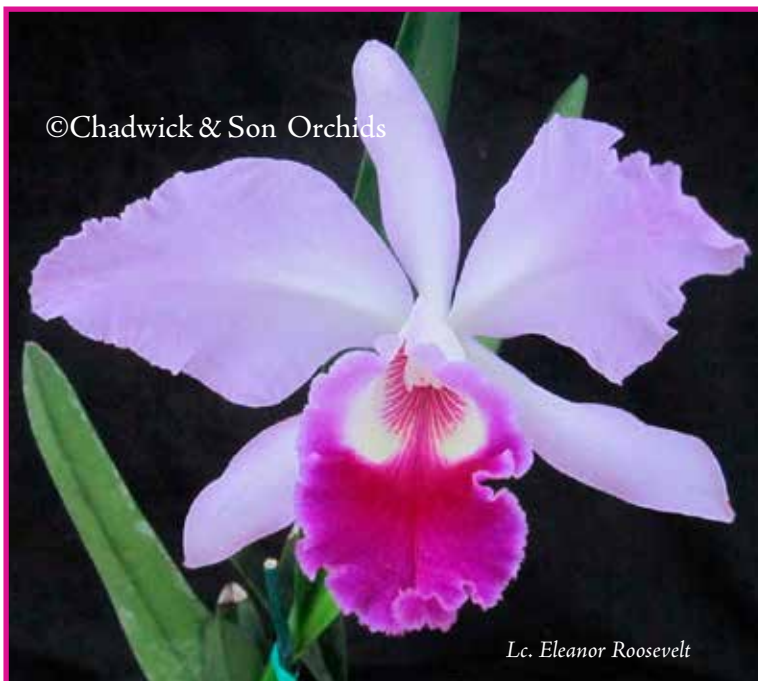
